Created in conjunction with the College of Advanced Wheelie Things, Wheelies for All will provide safe, effective transportation for people living with disabilities. Used multi-wheeled transporters (Wheelies) will be purchased and refurbished to sell to members of the community. The project involves workshops for volunteers to teach methods to refurbishing Wheelies, including safety checking, training the end-user in safe use of the Wheelies, and 'train the trainer' exercises to ensure continuity of the project. Residents with varying abilities will be employed in the refurbishment phase and the Wheelies will be sold at discounted cost to assist with payment of wages.

The \$8000 Funding will be used to: - Purchase x30 used wheelies to refurbish: \$4,000 - Develop brochures, training guides and other working documents: \$800 - Purchase tools, parts and equipment required for refurbishments: \$1,800 - Hire of premises to establish workshop: \$1,400

Wheelies For All creates a better and more inclusive future for residents in our local community as well as extending beyond to a wider 'audience'. Direct benefits to people living with a disability and their carers will include enhanced well-being and mobility. The Refurbishment phase of the project will support people with varying abilities in gaining part time employment and learning new skills whilst increasing their confidence. The project encourages community volunteering across various levels. It will further promote environmentally friendly practices while encouraging the involvement and participation of community groups, businesses and local institutions.

Does your project have the capacity to become self-sustainable? Please tell us how. (100 words max)

Through the sale of the Wheelies, the project will achieve an acceptable level of sustainability. The 'train the trainer' exercises of volunteers will help ensure continuity. The project itself will provide sustainable benefits to people living with disabilities and their carers, and will provide an avenue for ongoing part-time employment, which has the potential to increase the productivity and sales of the Wheelies over future years. With our access to available materials a greater focus can be applied to these skills and training of our workforce.

Training and skill development are a key focus of the project. Each part-time employee will have an Individual Employment Plan (IEP) detailing employment goals, training requirements and a training plan. Volunteers to the project will receive similar but appropriately targeted training (workshops and on the job).

Success will be measured via the number of new employment opportunities created for people living with a disability, the number of volunteers co-opted from the community, the number of Wheelies that are refurbished and the sale of these Wheelies.

This year we received \$5,000 from Wollongong Council Community Funding. In 2012 we received \$8,000 in funding from the IMB Bank Community Foundation.

As with any new project there is a risk that it will not be successful. However with considerable funding already committed by other organisations, we have been able to employ a strong project team who have a clear vision and strategy for how the project will be implemented, we believe the risk of failure is low. Another potential risk is the death or serious injury of a person using the Wheelies and have undertaken due diligence with legal and insurance companies to mitigate this risk. We believe there is no conflict of interest that IMB needs to be informed of.

Our Pilot projects have tested the mechanics of the plan with clear evidence that our planned major effort to be funded will be successful. We see this application as pursuing seed funding for a project that will have sustainable benefits well into the future.
